UUA General Assembly



The Unitarian Universalist Association passed an Action of Immediate Witness in Solidarity with Indigenous Water Protectors. Six Oceti Sakowin Camp elders and relatives came to Kansas City to attend UUA General Assembly in June, 2018, presenting a double-workshop on Saturday, and offering a public event of music and storytelling on Sunday evening. Funds were donated to a Faithify campaign to extend UU hospitality and support to these Elders and Friends though all of the UUA General Assembly.


UU Ministry for Earth hosted five workshops at UUA General Assembly focusing on Climate Justice. These workshops included "Risk-Taking & Law-Breaking: Faith-Inspired Civil Disobedience," "Holistic Management: Healing Systems, Spirits, and Society" (a philosophy and agricultural practice for regenerating healthy ecosystems), "Demanding Justice & Equity in Emergency Response," "Called to the Intersections of Justice," and others. Six Table Talks were offered that allowed people to participate in a small group session and an Environmenal Justice Tour highlighted intersectional issue around Kansas City.


UUMFE Financial Summary

Fiscal Year 2018 (July 2017 – June 2018)

Finances: Through the generosity of individual and congregational supporters and grantors – recently including the UUA and Cedar Tree Foundation – UUMFE is in a good financial position.

FY 2017-18 income = \$133,133 (donations = \$47,444; program grants and targeted donations = \$63,906; FY 2016-17 program grants balance carry-forward to FY 2017-18 budget = \$21,783)





FY 2017-18 expenses = \$124,590 (administration = \$54,620; programs = \$50,910; fundraising = \$847; FY 2017-18 program grants balance carry-forward to FY 2018-19 budget = \$18,213)

End of FY 2017-18 cash reserves = \$21,472 (in addition to FY 2018-19 program grants balance carry-forward)


